




SUMMARY

The Brussels' workshop is a co-production process between Brussels' region and local authorities, urban planner associations and universities. Illustrated by examples taken in the Canal area of Brussels, the workshop studies the issues related to the necessity to act at different scales and to articulate local with European and global dimensions. The workshop focuses on new approaches examining the urban renovation policies, professional knowledge and knows how, the roles of actors and stakeholders, new planning methods and urban design solutions. The workshop runs for two days combining presentations with case study visits of different projects and sites in the Canal area, and deals with global challenge impacting most cities such as international city competition, spatial and socio-economic polarisation, multilevel governance, neighbourhood development and scarcity (austerity) of resources. With professionals from around the world joining the workshop in Brussels we re-interpret, re-categorise, re-connect, re-use and re-invent the city.
